UMMC GME Clinical Learning Environment Review (CLER) Info & Tips

The ACGME is the largest organization that sets and monitors standards and oversees accreditation of graduate medical education sponsoring institutions and programs in the United States. In recognition of the public's need for a physician workforce capable of meeting the needs of a rapidly changing healthcare environment, the ACGME established the Clinical Learning Environment Review (CLER) Program in 2012

The CLER Program is designed to provide the clinical settings affiliated with ACGME-accredited institutions with periodic feedback that addresses the following six Focus Areas: Patient Safety; Health Care Quality; Teaming; Supervision; Well-Being; and Professionalism. The purpose is to evaluate, encourage and promote continuous improvements in the clinical learning environment. https://www.acgme.org/globalassets/pdfs/cler/1079acgme-cler2019pte-brochdigital.pdf

Each accredited sponsoring institution is required to periodically undergo a CLER site visit, approximately every 24 months. The University of Maryland Medical Center's three CLER site visits were conducted in 2014, 2016, and 2019. The reports are available upon request.

In 2020, UMMC GMEC established the CLER Subcommittee. Over a period of 8 months, the subcommittee used the CLER Pathways to Excellence 2.0 to assess the current status of UMMC and the benchmarks/expectations for the optimal learning environment. The summary was shared at the March 2021 GMEC Meeting.

From 2019 - 2021 UMMC as the Sponsoring Institution was selected to join Cohort 2 of the Pursuing Excellence in Clinical Learning Environments, Patient Safety Pathway Leaders https://www.acgme.org/initiatives/pursuing-excellence/overview/, which accelerated the alignment of GME and the CLE at UMMC.

Since the 2019 UMMC CLER Site Visit, the GMEC has benefited from the engagement with the Chief Quality Officer who leads the Medical Centers processes for Patient Safety and Clinical Effectiveness and other UMMC leaders in quality and safety. The following is an abridged summary of UMMC and GME aligned processes used to address components of CLER:
