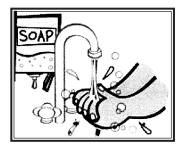




Hand washing with soap and water or alcohol-based hand cleaner is the best way to keep harmful germs from spreading. Hand washing is very important when you are in a hospital.
